

	Irish Dairy Cake		
	Carol Rasmussen		
	1 1/2 cups butter softened		
	3 Cups White Sugar		
	6 Eggs at room temperature		
	1 (8ounce) package cream cheese, softened		
	1 teaspoon vanilla extract		
	3 Cups all-purpose flou		
	Directions		
	Preheat oven to 300 degrees		
	 Grease and flour a Bundt Pan Cream butter and sugar together until thoroughly combined 		
	Beat in eggs, one at a time, beating each egg until fully incorpo-		
	rated before adding the next one.		
	Mix in cream cheese and vanilla extract		
	Mix in flour, about 1/2 cup at a time until batter is smooth and velowers.		
	Pour batter into the prepared pan.		
	Bake cake in the preheated oven until the top is golden brown,		
	about 11/2 hours. There will be a crusty top on top.		
	You can pour a glaze on top or just eat as is. Very similar to a pound cake. Enjoy 🛛		

INGREDIENTS

- 3½ cups Rice Chex cereal
- 3½ cups honey nut cheerios
- 1½ cups pretzels sticks
- 1/2 cup salted peanuts
- 16 ounces vanilla almond bark chopped (2 cups or 8
 - squares)
- 10 ounce bag easter M&Ms
- 1/2 cup butterscotch chips

INSTRUCTION

Prepare a sheet pan by lining it with parchment paper. Set it aside.

Mix together the rice Chex cereal, honey nut cheerios, pretzel sticks, and salted peanuts in a large bowl.

Melt the vanilla almond bark in the microwave using a large microwave safe dish. Microwave it in increments of 15 seconds, stirring after each interval, until it has melted completely

Pour the melted almond bark into the bowl with the cereal mixture and then toss together until thoroughly combined.

Gently fold in the easter M&Ms and butterscotch chips.

Transfer to the prepared sheet pan.

Spread everything out onto the sheet pan evenly and let it set for about 45 minutes. Once the almond bark has set and hardened, break into pieces before transferring to a serving dish.


