The Paul Geissler Automobile Museum

We are so lucky to have this beautiful museum right in our own backyard. This is the private collection of Paul Geissler, an 84-year old lover of the automobile. Mr. Geissler emigrated from Germany at an early age and fell in love with the American Packard automobile. He describes the Packard as the "American Rolls Royce. His collection at this time houses 16 meticulously restored cars, dating from 1918 to 1942. He will be adding to the collection as more cars are restored in the shop located at the back of the museum. Each car takes about a year to restore. There is also a viewing section at the front of the museum with a seating area to watch various films about the Packard car. He would eventually like to open this museum to the public. Mr. Geissler says "I'm proud of (the cars) and that's why I opened the museum, to show to people, especially the younger generation."

We will be visiting this outstanding collection of cars on Saturday, February 17. The museum is located at 207 Southwest Blvd. in Rohnert Park. We will be gathering in the parking lot in front of Target on Rohnert Park Expressway at 10:00 a.m. if you would like to carpool over to the museum. Otherwise meet us at the museum at 10:30 a.m. Mr. Geissler should be there to answer your questions and share his adventures of collecting his cars. He does request that if it isn't raining, that you drive your car as he would be delighted to see our wonderful collection also.

Model B Quarter-Ton Pickup Truck

Roger grew up riding in my care, many times in the pickup bed. My master came home for lunch every day, and I carried him faithfully to his destination. My other master, Pearl, had a nickname for me "puddle-jumper", and I lived outside for many years.

And one day my master was ready to go to work, and I just would not go as my clutch had frozen to the flywheel. I was taken out of service for a short period of time, and in 1960 my master and Roger started to take me apart, and then I knew I would be back on the road again. Well what can I say, my masters had a new plan for me, I was going to be a "hot rod". They took me completely apart and then I got a different engine, a big V-8 56 Olds, and they put juice brakes on me, a '39 Ford tranny, my body was all sanded and primed, my seat was recovered, and they put 12 volts in me. Next many parts were chromed including my new wheels. I had new tires and oh did I look good! I was driven only once, but I could now go very fast!

My master had a new house built in 1964, and I moved into a "new garage". But alas I was to sit in the garage for many years- but wait, as 2024 is here my master, Roger, is planning to get me out and get me into running condition again! This will be my second restoration - oh I can hardly wait to be driven again in the great outdoors!

Cupid M & M's

"Eat or Bake" Chocolate Chip Cookie Dough –24 count Cookies

Box of Brownie Mix

Silicone Heart Shaped cupcake baking pan—(12)

Heat oven to 350 degrees

Lightly grease Silicone Valentine cupcake pan (or regular cupcake baking pan)

Add 6-8 M & M's to the pan

Fill each cupcake with a square of precut chocolate cookie dough.

Make the Brownie mix according to the package directions.

Add a scoop of brownie mixture on top of the chocolate chip cookie dough.

Bake 25-30 minutes or until golden brown


