The Latest Addition to the Cantarutti Car Family (Our apologies to Henry!)

My love for cars, Fords in particular, began at a very young age when my father let me drive his 1946 Ford Club Coupe around our rural property. At that very moment, I made it my goal to work doing odd jobs for neighbors, family friends, or whoever would hire me so I could one day buy my own car. One of my jobs was working for a neighboring hay ranch owner baling hay. Occasionally, the ranch owner would go down to the neighborhood tavern and imbibe a little too much. Realizing he may not be capable of driving himself back home, he would ask me to come and check on him at the tavern periodically in case he needed a chauffeur. Although I wasn't old enough to have a driver's license, I'm sure I was much safer behind the wheel than he would have been. After working for him and many others, with the hard-earned money I had saved, I bought my first Ford in 1955 before I even had a driver's license. It was a Model A Ford pickup. My next vehicle purchase was a 1934 Ford Coupe in 1956, followed by another 1934 Ford Coupe and a 1946 Ford Coupe. All of the cars I could afford to buy were unrestored and in need of repairs, so Auto Shop was my favorite class in high school.

By the time I graduated from high school, the many hours I had spent working to earn enough to buy a new quality car paid off. I proudly walked into a Ford dealer and bought a brand new 1959 Ford Galaxy with cash. Sharon and I went on our first date in December 1961 in that car. Once we were married in February 1963 and began raising our two sons, we didn't have the time or money to invest in classic cars. Our goal was to secure our financial future by investing in commercial property whenever we had extra money. It wasn't until 1993 that Sharon and I purchased our first restored early Ford, a 1934 Ford Deluxe 3-Window Coupe. I had mentioned to Kenny Dyche, our fellow club member, that I was looking for one and Kenny happened to see one at the Pleasanton Good Guys gathering that year. He immediately called us and we committed to buy it. Once we owned the 34, Kenny suggested we join the Early Ford V8 Club, which we did in 1993. Since then, as you may have seen in the club roster, we have acquired two more Fords, a 1936 Ford Cabriolet and a 1937 Ford Deluxe Tudor Sedan.

When I was asked to contribute an article about one of my cars for this newsletter, I decided that since most of our club members have seen or know of our Fords, I would write about my latest purchase even though it is not a Ford.

When I was young I admired the looks of the big Buicks, so when I heard there was a 1950 Buick Super Convertible for sale that appeared to be in good condition I couldn't resist. The Buick was being sold by a classic car dealer in Rhode Island, and from the pictures of all areas of the car including the undercarriage, it appeared to be in excellent condition. Not having the time to fly to Rhode Island to inspect the car, I came up with a plan. I looked in our Early Ford V8 Club National Roster, and found a member who lived within a 10-minute drive from the dealer. The Ford Club member owned numerous cars, and seemed to be the perfect person to ask for an opinion. I called him to ask if I could pay him for his time to go to inspect the car for me. He said he would gladly do that for me. The next day he called me with a report that he had the car up on a hoist and it appeared to be in excellent condition with no rust. I decided to buy it.

As some of you are aware, Sharon and I spend part of the year in Montana. One of our friends there who is a classic car enthusiast suggested we join the local Bozeman Antique Auto Club. Its members are from all walks of life, and they drive all makes and models of antique cars. There is a very interesting assortment, some cars worth next to nothing, and others that are beautifully restored, with the most expensive being two original Cobras owned by one of the members. The 50 Buick will be a great car to take on tours with the Montana club, so we had the car transported to us in Montana in March of last year. One of our Montana car club members wrote this about our Buick in the club's April 2022 Newsletter:

"We didn't welcome any new members at the meeting, but we did welcome a new (old) car. The Cantaruttis bought a 1950 Buick convertible. It is a Super model with a black exterior and a bright red interior with a tan top, Sharp! The Super has power windows and an automatic transmission with only late 30s on the odometer. Louis says it is an older restoration with absolutely no rust, just what he wanted as a fun tour cruiser. In 1950 Buick offered three series, the Special, the Super and the Roadmaster. The Super models were the volume sellers with the 263 cubic inch overhead valve straight 8 engine developing 130 BHP. There were 12,259 Super convertibles produced that year. I personally liked those Buicks as it was the only year of the "waterfall-toothy" grille that flowed down and became part of the front bumper. No light weight either, tipping the scales at 3965 pounds. Now like a lot of us, Louis says something has to go. You see he is really a Ford man with a '34, '36' and that extremely nice modified '37 street rod. He says it will probably be the '37 slant back to make room for the Super. All I can say to this Ford guy is: "When Better Cars Are Built, Buick Will Build Them!"

This past summer I had the time to begin inspecting the Buick in depth, and so far, have only found minor issues with it. We're looking forward to going on some fun tours with the Montana club this year.

In closing, Sharon and I want you to know how much we have enjoyed belonging to the Santa Rosa club. Our Ford Club is truly a family affair, and we look forward to many more years of being members.


