2 (8oz) cans refrigerated crescent roll dough

2(8oz) packages cream cheese, softened

1 1/4 cups white sugar, divided

1 teaspoon vanilla

½ cup margarine, melted

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven TO 350 F. Grease 9x13 baking pan.

Unroll 1 can of crescent rolls and press dough into bottom of prepared pan. Set second can aside.

Mix together cream cheese, 1 cup sugar, and vanilla in a medium bowl until smooth and creamy. Spread over crescent dough layer. Unroll second can of crescent rolls and lay dough on top of cream cheese mixture; do not press down.

Pour melted butter over the entire pan. Combine remaining ¼ cup sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl and sprinkle on top.

Bake in preheated oven until top is crisp and golden, 25 to 30 minutes. Once cool, cut into 24 squares.


