

Grace Carpenter Hudson Museum Tour














- 1 Box white cake mix
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 cup cold water
- 1 tsp. Vanilla extract
- 1 Small box instant vanilla pudding
- 2 Cups heavy whipping cream
- 2 cans Comstock Cherry pie filling



Mix 1 can sweetened condensed milk with 1 cup of cold water and 1 teaspoon vanilla extract until blended. Add 1 small box of instant vanilla pudding. Mix and chill in refrigerator for about 5 minutes.

Whip 2 cups of whipping cream and fold into pudding mix.

Remove cake from dish and cut cake horizontally. Place bottom layer back into the 9x13 dish. Top with ½ of the pudding/whipped cream mix then spread 1 can of Comstock cherries over the top. Lay the second half of the cake on top and repeat layering with remaining half of the pudding/whipped cream mix and topping of Comstock cherries.

This is the cherry topped cake that Rochelle Berizzi brought to the picnic. Yum. Actually, double YUM!
