

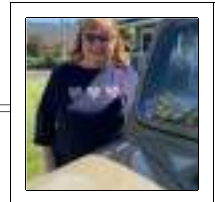

## Miranda 2023

A decade! That's how long Dave & Charlene Trabucco have been organizing and leading RERG#27's annual fall tour to Miranda and the latest installment was a really good one.

As the Ford Faithful gathered at Adel's in Healdsburg, it was an overcast and cool morning but soon warmed up. In the group was Dave & Charlene in a 47 coupe; Gloria & Dennis McIntosh in a 37 Fordor sedan; Ron Mollo & Jan Taurian in a 46 coupe; Basil Scott, Val & Victoria in a 46 convertible; Steve & Julie McClain in a 51 Victoria; Tom & Kathy in a 56 hardtop; Mike & Amy Buegeleisen in a 36 cabriolet; Bill & Denise Burns in a 48 convertible; Dave & Carol Rasmussen in a 35 pickup; Rick & Bev Tamagno in a 37 Tudor sedan; Dan & Wendy Pallo in a 40 coupe; and John & Patty in a 04 T-Bird. We made our usual stop in Willets and then continued up 101 to the rest stop for our "running board" lunch, arriving at Miranda at midafternoon, with a slight delay due to a bridge-out detour. It was a hot trip up with temperatures in the 80's most of the way and a high of 96 just before we got to Miranda. Check-in took a little longer than usual due to a locksmith changing out all the locks in our rooms but we used the time to move tables and chairs to the central green and then sat around talking, while Mike and Amy took the opportunity to hone their corn hole game. (You'll have to ask Mike how he was able to haul the cornhole equipment up in a 36 cabriolet.) The guys grilled a variety of meats while the gals laid out an assortment of salads and desserts. We never go hungry at these events and this was no exception! People lingered after the meal and caught up things.

Breakfast at the Tamagno's started at 7:00 am and we were on the road by 9:30 am and winded our way thru Eureka to the Blue Ox. (I think we arrived by four different routes but we all made it.) The Blue Ox Millworks and Historic Village defies description but I'll try. It is a ramshackle collection of buildings. (If you've ever seen the Robin William's movie, Popeye, picture the village where Olive Oyl lived.) It started with a condemned building that used to house a power plant for part of Eureka, including the rail system. It now houses many shops for painting, mill work, lathe work, printing, planing and textile weaving. Other buildings house ceramics, lapidary, chickens, a puppet theater and more. There was even an oven for making charcoal from scrap wood. An abandoned 50 Buick resided among all this. A derelict 46 Ford Woodie, without wood, resided in one of the buildings along with three carriages.

This is a working facility and makes custom wood trim, windows, columns, doors and more for Victorian buildings. It makes all the wood trim needed to maintain the Carson House (which our club toured on a previous year). It also runs a school to teach high school students these various crafts. Originally, they took only at-risk students, who had been kicked out of so many schools that they had nowhere to go. The school has been so successful that "regular" students asked to attend and now do so as well. (continued on page 6)

Our docent, Shawn, was as energetic as she was knowledgeable. One of the most interesting exhibits was a collection of human-powered saws from the late 1860s to the 1940s in the main building. Many were powered by sitting down and pedaling, much like using a stationary bicycle. Shawn demonstrated how to operate the scroll saw and a machine for making picket fences. She also ran a hand-cranked, self-feeding table saw for ripping boards. She made it look easy and she said it could rip boards as thick as 1 1/2 inch hand cranked! Shawn also demonstrated how an old printing press was used. Before they can graduate, students have to make a yearbook about themselves and the school, including design, layout, printing and binding the yearbook. We were able to see many of the yearbooks.

She also told us about Eric Hollenbeck, the owner and founder of Blue Ox. It's a really interesting story but too much for this article. However, Eric joined our group by driving up in the largest forklift I have ever seen. It was a 1950s combination forklift and log hauler. He especially wanted us to see it because it was powered by an old flathead Ford engine, probably an 8BA. Eric was hugely entertaining as he told many stories about the Blue Ox. Almost all the equipment and machinery were scrounged, donated or traded for. (You can learn more about him and the Blue Ox by going to the Discovery+ channel to view a series on *The Craftsman*.)

We could have spent more time there but we're Early Ford V8ers and we needed to eat. We all drove to Jack's Seafood for lunch. We were in a large room with two long tables that could accommodate all of us. After lunch, we went across a large parking lot to Dave Taylor's Chocolate Factory where we sampled various, mostly dark, chocolates. Purchases were made and it was time to head back to Miranda.

Almost everyone played cornhole that afternoon, accompanied by catcalls and commentary from the spectators. Later, we had hot dogs and chili, complements of grillmaster, Dave, along with salads and desserts from the day before. After dinner, Charlene provided a recap of tours from the previous ten years and Dave presented birdhouses he had crafted for all the attendees. All the birdhouse roofs were made from vintage license plates whose years matched the year of members' cars. What a treat! Mike had recently acquired a collection of plates and offered them to Dave to fabricate the birdhouse roofs and Bill provided all the wood. The birdhouses were really a big hit. The Trabucco's announced that this was their last year hosting the Miranda Tour and that Steve and Julie would hosting the tours from now on. The club members all expressed heartfelt thanks for the efforts of the Trabucco's over the years.

The next morning, we had breakfast at the Tamagno's and then replaced all the tables and chairs. The Cahill's and MacIntosh's left earlier but the rest of us departed at 9:45 am. It was an uneventful trip back with a stop at the Hamburger Ranch for lunch in their tented, outdoor patio. That concluded a really great weekend with our RERG#27 friends. 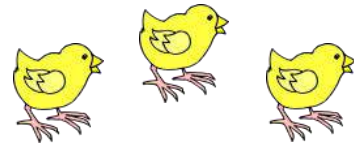

### CROISSANT OMELET CASSEROLE

#### Ingredients:

- 1 can crescent dinner rolls , 8 oz. refrigerated
- 1 1/2 cups ham, thinly sliced or chopped
- 1 1/2 cups cooked sausage crumbles, \*optional  
(if you use both meats cut to 3/4 cup of each)
- 6 eggs
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 1 cup shredded Mozzarella Cheese
- green onions, or parsley for garnish, optional

#### Instructions:

Heat oven to 350°F.

Unroll dough in 13x9-inch baking dish; press to cover bottom of dish, firmly pressing perforations and seams together to seal.

Top with meat.

In a mixing bowl, whisk eggs, milk and pepper until blended. Pour over meat.

Top with cheeses.

Bake for 25 min. or until center is set.

Sprinkle with parsley & serve!

### CHEDDAR BAY SAUSAGE BALLS

#### Ingredients:

- 1 (11.36-oz) package Red Lobster Cheddar Bay Biscuit mix
- 1 (8-oz) package cream cheese softened
- 1¼ cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 lb sausage uncooked

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 400°F.

In the bowl of an electric stand mixer fitted with a dough hook, combine biscuit mix and seasoning packet, sausage, cream cheese, and cheddar cheese. Mix until everything is incorporated into the sausage.

Shape into 1-inch balls. Place on a parchment-lined baking sheet. (Can freeze at this point)

Bake for 15-20 minutes, until golden brown.

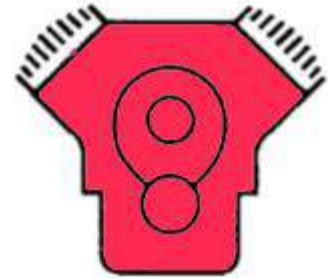

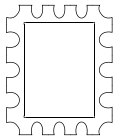
